



# Site establishment at Marsh Street, Arncliffe

October 2021

Transport for NSW is building the M6 Stage 1, a four kilometre twin tunnel connection between the M8 at Arncliffe and President Avenue at Kogarah, linking south Sydney to the wider motorway network.

# How will we establish our site?

From Wednesday 27 October work will start to establish our tunnelling site at Marsh Street, Arncliffe, in the same compound used to build the M8.

Work to establish our site will include:

- replacing site offices and upgrading workshops and worker amenities
- repairing existing tunnel access points and the acoustic shed for re-use
- installing environmental controls including an exclusion fence to protect local fauna

### **COVID-19 Public Health Orders**

The safety of our community is our highest priority. We are working closely with our contractors to ensure the COVID-19 safety plans are in place and our construction teams are complying with current NSW Government Public Health Orders.

## Our work schedule

Work to establish our tunnelling site will take up to three months to complete, weather permitting.

Standard construction work hours are:

- 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
- 8am to 1pm, Saturday

# How will the work affect you?

Our work activities will create some noise and vibration for the local community and we thank you for your patience while this important work is completed. We are committed to working with local residents and businesses to try to mitigate the impact of our work as much as possible.

To minimise our noise impact we will:

- retain the existing noise walls and acoustic sheds
- include respite periods from high impact noise activities. The respite hours are
  - 11am to 12pm and 3pm to 4pm, Monday to Friday
  - 11am to 12pm, Saturday
    There will be no high impact noise work on Sundays and public holidays
- where possible, limit use of noisy equipment and position away from properties while in operation

To minimise impact from vibration we will:

- undertake pre-construction property condition surveys before commencing potentially impacting works. If your property is eligible, you will be sent a letter offering a survey of your property
- plan our work and implement construction methods that cause less vibration
- where possible, select equipment that minimises vibration

We will regularly undertake monitoring at various locations in your local area to determine that noise and vibration are effectively managed within predicted levels.
