



Ongoing construction of the shared pedestrian and cyclist pathway from Chuter Avenue to Civic Avenue

M6 Stage 1

April 2025

As part of the M6 Stage 1 project, construction of the shared pedestrian and cyclist pathway continues in 2025.

When and where we'll be working

In April, work continues between Civic Avenue and Chuter Avenue through Scarborough Park. Our standard work hours are from **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 6pm, Saturday.**

Our out-of-hours work will take place on the President Avenue bridge on the following dates:

- 14 and 15 April.

What work are we doing?

Our day work will include:

- formwork, pouring concrete and constructing Scarborough Park boardwalk and President Avenue bridge structures
- welding, painting, scaffolding and installation of lighting poles, handrails, and drainage pipes for President Avenue bridge
- installing steel boardwalk structures and upgrading drainage in Scarborough Park
- excavating, installing underground conduits and lighting poles for future pathway lighting along the alignment
- pouring concrete for the shared pathway and along Civic Avenue near President Avenue, including line marking for a new pedestrian zebra crossing

- placement and compaction of the foundation based on the shared pathway, including the use of a vibration compact roller
- ongoing earthworks, tree pruning, vegetation removal and maintaining environmental controls to manage erosion and sediment
- ongoing landscaping work, including planting native plant species and new trees
- delivering and removing materials, such as gravel, sandstone, concrete, and reinforcement via sites on Civic Avenue, Chuter Avenue and President Avenue
- commencing work to upgrade the crossing on Chuter Avenue at the intersection of Robinson Street, and Banks Street. At Robinson Street work will include removal of the existing refugee island, milling, asphaltting and line marking. At Banks Street, work will involve the installation of a speed calming device (speed hump) and line marking
- installing traffic calming devices (speed humps) and line marking on Marshal Avenue at the intersections with Oakdale Avenue and Lachal Avenue.

Our out of hours work will include

- welding, painting, scaffolding and installation of lighting poles, handrails, and drainage work for President Avenue bridge.



What will this mean for you?

The footpath in Scarborough Park (from Civic Avenue to Chuter Avenue) remains closed throughout construction. Access to Scarborough Park and Civic Reserve is maintained through alternate entrances on Civic Avenue near the intersection of Marshall Street and south of the intersection at Annette Street, as well as on Chuter Avenue near the intersection of Robinson Street.

Temporary changes to traffic may occur near our site gates on President Avenue.

The pedestrian pathway on the northern side of President Avenue remains temporarily closed with pedestrian and cyclist access available on the southern side. Please follow the direction of signage and traffic control.

Managing our impacts

We will manage dust by using a water cart and manage noise by using squawkers instead of beepers on vehicles. We'll turn off equipment and vehicles when they are not being used. We use noise and dust monitoring to measure our impact to the local community.

Respite for one hour will occur every three hours during high impact day activities. High impact work on Saturday will finish by 1pm.

Please follow our traffic signs and the directions of traffic control. Boom gates, barriers and stop-slow traffic management will be in place to ensure the safety of workers and the community when working on or near live traffic. Partial road closures and pedestrian diversions may be in place to facilitate works.
