We are upgrading existing pedestrian and cycleway paths along Victoria Road as well as local streets in Rozelle to improve the connectivity, safety and access of our active transport links in and around the Rozelle Interchange.

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of Wangal country and pay our respect to Elders past and present.

Overview of work

Transport for NSW (Transport) is making improvements to local streets in Rozelle between Springside Street and the intersection of Gordon Street and Lilyfield Road to improve connectivity to the soon to be open, Rozelle Parklands. These improvements include:

- new dedicated cycleway
- new speed bumps
- removal and relocation of existing signage
- new signage
- re-surfacing road and footpaths
- improved line marking on footpaths

In addition to the upgrades on local roads, Transport will be upgrading the existing shared path along the eastbound side of Victoria Road, removing unnecessary signage and making improvements to the footpaths and wayfinding at this location.

Please note that some of this work involves temporary installations until permanent structures can be installed in 2024.

When and where we'll be working

Work is expected to start on Monday 20 November 2023 and will take about four weeks to be completed, weather permitting. Standard work hours are **7am to 6pm**, **Monday to Friday** and **8:00 am to 6:00 pm Saturdays**. Some work activities are required outside of our standard work hours. We will notify you of this out of hours work in advance.

There is also some night work planned along Victoria Road East between Crystal and Roberts streets. If this is expected to impact you directly, we will notify you ahead of time.

What this means for you?

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles (trucks including excavator and concrete mixer)
- footpath and road closures or detours
- possible dust, noise and vibration from machinery and equipment used during the work
- line marking and signage work
- temporary changes to parking near work sites

Managing our work

We plan to lessen our disturbance to the community and environment by ensuring we:

- carry out noisier work prior to midnight
- limit the use of multiple equipment at the same time during the same activity as well as duration, where possible
- turn off equipment when not in use
- use of non-tonal reversing alarms on all plant and equipment
- avoid loud talking, shouting, car radios and use two-way radios where possible
- use noise blankets when operating concrete saws and drills.

If any of this work is expected to impact your property access, cause additional noise or scheduled to take place during out of hours, we will notify you directly.
