

# Nobby Beach urban revitalisation

**The final stage of the Nobby Beach urban revitalisation works will commence from Tuesday 27 January 2026 and continue until June 2026 on the Gold Coast Highway Service Road between Lavarack Road and Chairlift Avenue, Nobby Beach.**

## Works include

- Establishing a construction area with site fencing to safely separate the work area from pedestrians and motorists
- Excavating, spoil removal, saw cutting and jackhammering, concreting, paving and road pavement construction
- Removal of redundant drainage and installation of new drainage and water connections
- Removal of existing road and kerb infrastructure to enable construction of the new shared-use area
- Installing urban amenities, including bike shelters and seating areas
- Implementing streetscape improvements, such as street lighting, safety bollards, and landscaping.

## What to expect

- Nearby business operators and residents can expect an increase in construction activity including moderate to high levels of noise, noticeable vibration, potential odours and vehicle movements. Noisier works will be completed earlier in the evening where possible
- Permanent removal of parking on Gold Coast Highway side as part of the revitalisation work area – Stage 2. For more information see [www.gclr3.com.au/constructing-nobby-beach](http://www.gclr3.com.au/constructing-nobby-beach)
- Changes to pedestrian movements through the work area. Signage will be in place to assist pedestrians to safely navigate around the works
- Lighting will be used during night works for safety. This will be directed away from residences and businesses where possible.

## Traffic changes

- The southbound and northbound lanes of the Gold Coast Highway Service Road between Lavarack Road and Chairlift Avenue will close to vehicles
- Access to the northern end of the precinct will be maintained via the U-turn facility at the Wave Street and Gold Coast Highway intersection
- Access to the southern end of the precinct will be via the Gold Coast Highway, turning into Chairlift Avenue. Vehicles turning into Chairlift Avenue will only be able to access Chairlift Avenue and Great Hall Drive
- The Albicore Street and Chairlift Avenue intersections will remain open.

# Timing

- Day works between 6.30am and 6.30pm, Monday to Sunday
- Night works between 6.30pm and 6.30am, each night from Sunday evening to Friday morning
- No works will occur on public holidays unless otherwise notified. Wet weather or unforeseen circumstances may result in changes to the work schedule.
