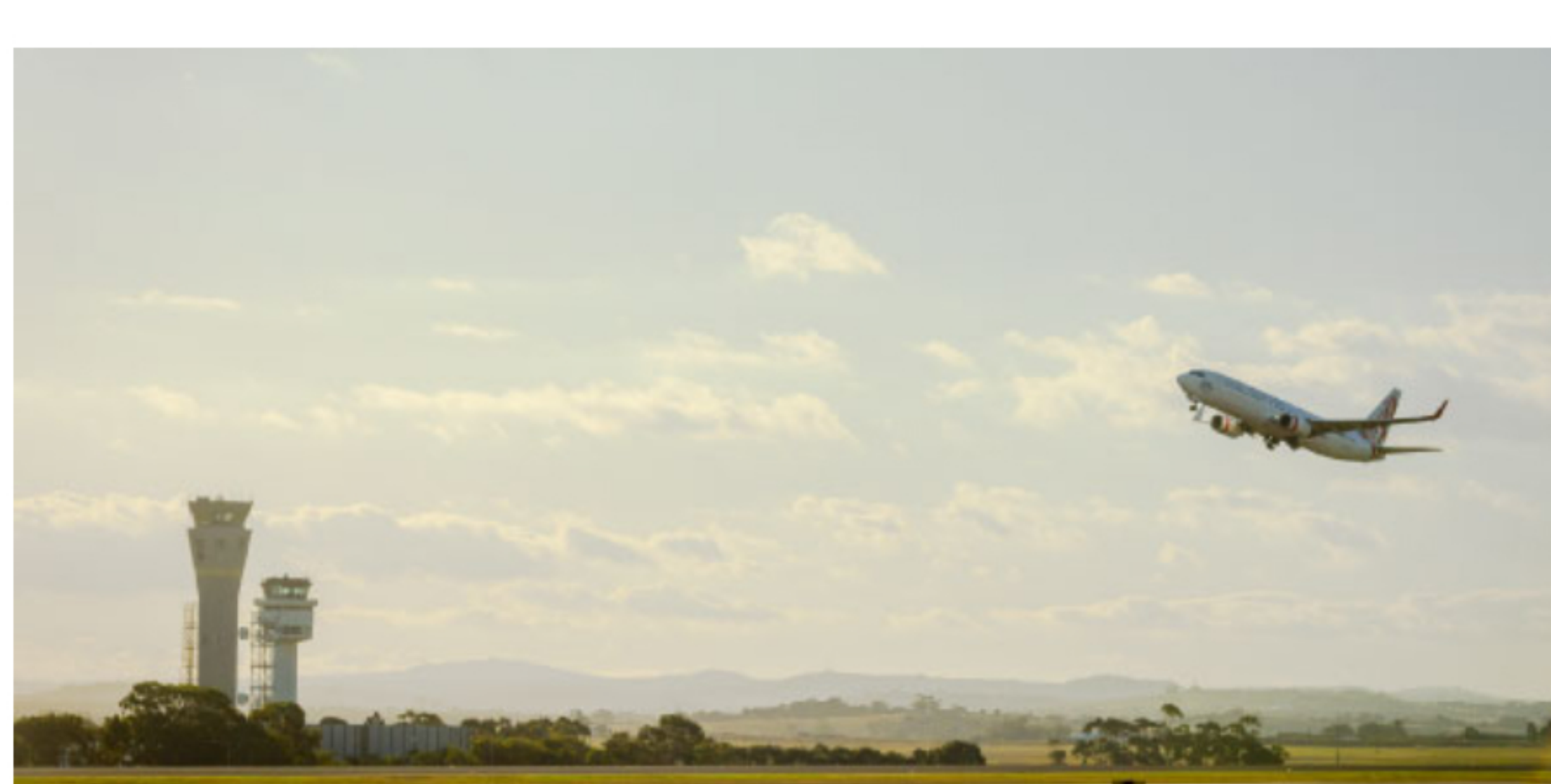

Sunbury Road upgrades underway

Ahead of construction of the third runway, we're making changes to Sunbury Road to make it safer for construction vehicles to enter and exit the airport. This includes installation of a temporary intersection and traffic lights between the Wildwood Rd and Oaklands Rd roundabouts.

Building a new front door



Melbourne Airport is upgrading its front door, with new, larger pick-up and drop-off zones for Terminals 1, 2 and 3 due to open in the second half of 2026 and a new express off-ramp from the Tullamarine Freeway. This project will pave the way for an expansion of the international terminal.
