Descriptor	The presentation guides students through interactive learnings about safety in and around construction sites.

Curriculum alignment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Health and Physical Education: personal, social, and community health The focus on safety around construction sites and the use of PPE aligns with learning about health, safety, and wellbeing. Students learn to describe and apply protective behaviours and help-seeking strategies in various situations. Making healthy and safe choices: Activities like discussing safety gear, observing construction sites, and understanding the role of a Safety Officer help students understand the importance of safety in different environments. Aims	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Increase awareness of careers in construction and the role of a safety advisor Provide hands-on experience and understanding of safety gear Enhance observational skills and awareness of construction site activities Intensify awareness about staying safe around construction sites Equip students with a robust foundation in scientific principles and practices through the Science Tram, seamlessly transitioning this knowledge into the Safety Tram to prepare them to know how to be safe on and around light rail.
