Out-of-hours works – tower crane dismantling and removal on Phillip Street

Construction activity is ongoing at the Powerhouse Parramatta project site and out-of-hours works is required to dismantle and remove the final crane on the project.

Out-of-hours works

From **7pm Friday 27 February 2026 to 5am Monday 2 March 2026 (inclusive)**, a full road closure of Phillip Street between Wilde Avenue and Dirrabarri Lane will be in place for main works partner Lendlease to safely dismantle the projects' final tower crane.

These works are required to be completed outside standard construction hours due to safety and logistical considerations, including the need to safely establish lifting equipment and traffic controls within Phillip Street.. The works will be carried out in accordance with the project's Development Consent and relevant Authority approvals.

What work is occurring

Activities will include:

- Establishing a mobile crane on Phillip Street near Horwood Place to dismantle and remove the tower crane;
- Installing temporary traffic and pedestrian controls to ensure public safety;
- The progressive dismantling of crane sections using hand tools, forklift, a franna crane and mobile crane for lifting and lowering crane segments; and
- Heavy vehicle movements to remove dismantled crane components from site.

These activities will occur intermittently throughout the approved out-of-hours period, including during evenings.

What to expect

The local community may experience:

- intermittent noise associated with lifting operations and vehicle movements
- temporary changes to pedestrian and traffic conditions
- area specific lighting within the work zone.

All reasonable and feasible measures will be implemented to minimise disruption, including careful planning of lifts, coordination of vehicle movements and supervision of works.

Key dates

Start: 7pm Friday 27 February 2026

Finish: 5am Monday 2 March 2026

(weather and site conditions permitting)

Location

Phillip Street, between Wilde Ave and Dirrabarri Lane, Parramatta

Traffic and pedestrian management

- Vehicle access will be restricted between Wilde Avenue and Dirrabarri Lane, including access to Phillip Street via Horwood Place. Driveway access will be maintained at all times under the management of traffic control.
- Pedestrian access will be maintained along the southern footpath of Phillip Street under the management of traffic control.
- Dirrabarri Lane will remain open at all times, with traffic to follow the detour signage via Marsden Street.
- A detour will be set up with clear detour signage to be established along with traffic control throughout the area to assist and ensure the safety of the community.

Further detail of detour routes and closures are provided in the diagram overleaf.

Health and safety

There will be intermittent noise throughout the period, including during the evenings. All effort will be made to minimise noise, with a focus on completing noisier activities as early in the shift as possible.

Strict environmental and planning controls are in place to manage noise, dust and vibration.

Construction hours

These out-of-hours works will take place between **7pm Friday 27 February 2026 to 5am Monday 2 March 2026 (inclusive)**, (weather and site conditions permitting). The following weekend (7pm Friday 6 March 2026 to 5am Monday 9 March 2026) has been scheduled for contingency.

All other construction activities will be carried out during the approved construction hours:

- Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm
- Saturday, 8am to 5pm.
