The NSW Government is delivering a new Sydney Fish Market that will support tourism and the fishing industry and return inaccessible parts of the harbour foreshore to the community.

#### Construction update

Work to build the new Sydney Fish Market continues to progress on schedule. With the main building piles now installed, preparations are underway to dewater the cofferdam and start the main structure works. Activities on site include:

- Ongoing wharf and promenade piling
- · Completing the cofferdam
- Dewatering the smaller box cofferdam
- Completing the replacement of the existing seawall with a strengthened and battered area.
- Ongoing night works to provide power to the new building.

# **Upcoming works**

Over the next three months, construction activities will include:

- · Installing three tower cranes
- Dewatering the main cofferdam. This involves draining the enclosed construction area to enable the start of main works.
- Promenade piling
- · Power supply night works
- · Starting the main building structure.

### Cleaning up with Seabin

The five Seabins installed in and around the new Sydney Fish Market construction site continue to clean up Blackwattle Bay. Quarterly data shows the huge impact these units are having. In the period between June and August 2022, the five units have:

- Filtered 342 million litres of water (equivalent to 137 Olympic swimming pools)
- · Captured an estimated 978kg of marine litter
- Captured an estimated 250,456 plastic items

Over 50% of items captured during this period were harmful microplastics.

## Respite for local Year 12 students

To support students at the neighbouring Sydney Secondary College completing their Higher School Certificate (HSC) examinations, respite hours have been temporarily amended during the HSC examination period from Wednesday 12 October 2022 until Friday 4 November 2022. During this respite period, noisy works such as rock breaking, rock hammering, sheet piling, pile driving, and similar activities will not be carried out.
