# Sydney Gateway

Work update
December 2022 and January 2023



Sydney Gateway will provide a new, toll-free connection from St Peters Interchange to improve journey times to Sydney Airport, the M5 and Eastern Distributor.

## Our work in December 2022 / January 2023 includes:

- Ongoing flyover and ramps construction activities on Sir Reginald Ansett Drive and Qantas Drive, Mascot. Work will include headstock, girder and barrier installation.
- Oversized deliveries of bridge structures to our work sites at Mascot, Tempe (some via Bellevue Street) and St Peters including heavy vehicle deliveries and lifting activities.
- Deliveries for the arch bridge structures to our Tempe Lands work site via Nigel Love Bridge with ongoing assembly works, including out-of-hours.
- Building demolition work continues along Qantas Drive Mascot, involving earthworks.
- Road pavement work continuing eastbound along Qantas Drive Mascot, involving asphalting and traffic changes.

- Bridge and road support works including piling at our Northern Lands work site, St Peters.
- Retaining wall construction and associated works.
   There is a footpath closure on the eastern side of Canal Road, St Peters to facilitate this work.
- Relocating, removing and installing utilities on Airport Drive, Qantas Drive and King Street, Mascot and Bellevue Street. St Peters.
- Ongoing works on the pedestrian and cycle path along Alexandra Canal including the installation of lighting, handrails and CCTV.
- Trimming and clearing trees and vegetation.

### Holiday shutdown period

The majority of our work at Sydney Gateway will pause from 23 December 2022 to 9 January 2023. There will be ongoing work in our Northern Lands site at St Peters during this holiday closure. These activities include drainage work along the rail corridor from 24 December 2022 to 3 January 2023.

Our Tempe site may receive some out-of-hours deliveries during this closure.

We will continue to monitor our sites and may also perform some maintenance on our equipment.

We thank you for your patience during our work this year and look forward to an exciting 2023.

### How our work may impact you

We'll use plant and equipment that includes hand tools, welding tools, cranes, grinders, excavators, piling rigs, elevated work platforms, vacuum trucks, ground compactors, vibratory rollers, asphalt pavers, jack hammers, road saws, rattle guns, chain saws, traffic management tools and construction vehicles.

We'll minimise noise associated with this work by using non-tonal reversing beepers on machinery, turning off equipment and vehicles when not in use, using noise mats where feasible, directing noisy equipment away from properties and other on-site noise reduction measures.

### Our work hours

Our standard work will take place during the day from 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and from 8am to 6pm on Saturdays.

We'll also be working at night usually from Sunday to Thursday between 8pm and 5am. Some of our work may be done outside of these hours when it's low impact, required for safety reasons or prescribed by regulatory authorities. This includes Sydney Airport regulations which require the use of large cranes to be used at night when planes are not using the airport.

Traffic (including pedestrian and cycling) conditions will change while we're working. Please plan ahead and follow the direction of traffic controllers.
