Late 2020

Transport for NSW takes a fresh look at the project, starting with a strategic review of alternatives to a ramp



Early 2021

Transport for NSW determines that a ramp is needed and assesses around 30 options to arrive at a linear and a looped concept



June 2021

Linear and looped concepts, and plans for the separated cycleway on Alfred Street, placed on public display



August 2021

Linear ramp selected as the preferred ramp concept. Registration of Interest launched to find leading design firms to refine the linear ramp concept



November 2021

Three shortlisted design teams shortlisted to enter a competitive design process.



December 2021 – January 2022

Three ramp designs, and updated plans for the Alfred Street Cycleway, placed on public display



February 2022

Design Jury assesses the designs, and feedback from the public consultation process
