Warringah Freeway Upgrade and Western Harbour Tunnel

Work notification | Out of hours work three month lookahead

January - March 2024



We are simplifying the Warringah Freeway, making it safer and easier to use, and more efficient and reliable for the benefit of all road users, including public transport users. The upgrade will connect with Western Harbour Tunnel to create a western bypass of the Sydney CBD, taking pressure off the Sydney Harbour Bridge, Sydney Harbour Tunnel and Anzac Bridge.

Warringah Freeway Upgrade (WFU)

Zipping up road safety

Construction on the Warringah Freeway will progress more efficiently and safely with the introduction of an innovative 2.2 tonne road barrier zipper machine that installs up to four kilometres of temporary barriers each night and zips them up before the morning peak hour.

The 14.8 metre long road zipper barrier machine is being used for the first time in construction in Australia.

The upgrade of 4km of the Warringah Freeway requires ongoing nightly lane closures to allow construction work to be undertaken without interruption to peak travel times.

The zipper machine will allow up to three extra hours for construction crews to work on the freeway at night and most importantly, maximises the work that can be carried out behind physical protection rather than workers being exposed to live traffic.

Western Harbour Tunnel (WHT)

Heading towards the harbour

In November, Western Harbour Tunnel started roadheader tunnelling from the Cammeray temporary construction site. Over the next few months our tunnelling activities will continue, moving south under the Warringah Freeway towards Sydney Harbour.

At the Ridge Street temporary construction site in North Sydney, site establishment work continues. This includes the installation of a temporary power supply and connection to water and sewerage services. This work is expected to be complete in March 2024, weather permitting.

In early 2024, Western Harbour Tunnel will take over the Berry Street construction site in North Sydney which is currently used by Warringah Freeway Upgrade. Work in early 2024 will include site establishment such as site access, installing site sheds and worker amenities. Once established, the site will be used to support the construction of a southbound on ramp for Western Harbour Tunnel

Working together

The Warringah Freeway Upgrade and Western Harbour Tunnel project teams are working together in your area. We know building projects of this scale and significance does not go without impact and we are committed to making this as seamless and easy as possible for the community.

We plan our work together to minimise cumulative impacts on you. This includes coordinating our noisy and out of hours work, combining our communications activities including these notifications, door knocks and street meetings.

Standard work hours

Where possible, we will carry out work during the day however, ongoing work outside of standard construction hours will be needed to maintain safety for road users and workers, and to keep people moving during peak travel times.

Our approved standard construction hours are **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 6pm on Saturday**.

Work outside standard construction hours

We stage our out of hours work to help minimise impacts for residents. Work which may impact nearby residents in one area will be carried out for up to three nights per week, with only two consecutive nights per week and no more than 10 nights per month. There may be occasions where we need to change the sequence of nights we work outside standard construction hours so we can complete the activity sooner. We will consult with the community and seek approval from the NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) before making any changes to the out of hours work periods as outlined in this notification.

Why we work outside standard construction hours

We need to work outside standard construction hours to mitigate a range of safety and operational risks, including:

- safety space to reduce interactions between motorists, pedestrians and workers when we are building over and next to roads and live traffic
- traffic management when we work next to, over or on existing roads we may need to stop, detour or reduce traffic to one lane
- service and utility disruptions to minimise disruptions to essential services and utilities for local communities
- oversized deliveries to allow delivery of oversized machinery or structures that police or other authorities determine require special arrangements to transport along public roads
- some emergency works that immediately impact road safety.

How we manage our work

Our work activities will often require the use of machinery that generates noise, light and vibration. To minimise the impact of this work we will:

- turn off machinery when not in use
- install hoarding or shade cloth around our temporary construction sites, where possible
- use acoustic blankets to minimise noise, where feasible
- direct temporary lighting down and away from properties
- plan activities that are close to residents during standard construction hours or early evening, where possible
- fit equipment with devices to minimise noise, particularly non-tonal reversing beepers
- monitor noise periodically so we can manage any potential impacts and adjust our work as required.

All work will be carried out in line with the projects' environmental approvals.

Managing construction noise

In April 2022, the EPA issued an Environmental Protection Licence (EPL) to the Warringah Freeway Upgrade contractor, CPB Downer Joint Venture (CPBD JV). As identified in the EPL, as well as CPBD JV's approved Construction Noise and Vibration Management Plan and approved Construction Noiseand Vibration Impact Statements (CNVIS), CPBD JV is required to undertake noise modelling and monitoring when construction activities start. The CNVIS are submitted to the EPA and an independent acoustic advisor. To view these documents, visit nswroads.work/wfuportal.

In May 2023, the EPA issued an EPL to the Western Harbour Tunnel Stage 2 contractor, ACCIONA. As identified in the EPL, as well as ACCIONA's approved Construction Noise and Vibration Management Plan and approved CNVIS, ACCIONA is also required to undertake noise modelling and monitoring when construction activities start. The CNVIS are submitted to the EPA and an independent acoustic advisor. To view these documents visit nswroads.work/whtportal.


