

Transport for NSW Warringah Freeway Upgrade Design and construct contract awarded

About the Warringah Freeway Upgrade

The NSW Government's vision for Sydney is one of an integrated road and public transport network that gives you the freedom to choose how and when you get around, no matter where you live and work.

The Western Harbour Tunnel and Warringah Freeway Upgrade is a major transport infrastructure project that will make it easier, faster and safer to get around Sydney. By creating a western bypass of the Sydney CBD, the Western Harbour Tunnel will take pressure off the Sydney Harbour Bridge, Sydney Harbour Tunnel, ANZAC Bridge and Western Distributor corridors to improve transport capacity in and around Sydney Harbour.

The Western Harbour Tunnel and Warringah Freeway Upgrade project along with Beaches Link, is expected to support around 15,000 full-time equivalent jobs during construction.

We are pleased to announce we have achieved another significant project milestone with the design and construction of the Warringah Freeway Upgrade being awarded to CPB Contractors and Downer EDI Works in a joint venture.

The Warringah Freeway Upgrade is the first stage of work in the NSW Government's Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link Program. The \$1.18 billion design and construction contract has been awarded to CPB Contractors and Downer EDI Works in a joint venture.

With CPB Contractors and Downer EDI Works on board, the first step over the coming months is to work with them to further develop plans on how we will manage the impacts of construction while we build the project.

These plans will detail how we will manage issues like noise and vibration, air quality, contamination, traffic and access and consider our community, stakeholders, road users and the local environment. The plans will describe the construction methods that will be used to minimise impacts to those who live, work and travel through the project area. You will be able to see these plans on our interactive portal once they are prepared and approved by the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment.

Warringah Freeway Upgrade Benefits



Early works are already underway with the main work to start early next year. Construction is expected to take approximately five years to complete, subject to the detailed design and construction program.

The Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link Program is expected to support up to 15,000 fulltime-equivalent jobs during construction, with the Warringah Freeway Upgrade supporting up to 600 direct jobs. We look forward to working closely with our delivery partners, the community and our stakeholders during the delivery of the project.

Working with the community

We know building a project of this kind in a large busy city like Sydney, will come with some disruption to day to day life and will change the surroundings of residents living near our construction sites. Every effort is being made to work with our communities to minimise this.

We acknowledge that communities have changed due to the impact of COVID-19 and we will continue to ensure there is strong engagement between the community and the project team to identify opportunities and minimise impacts as we deliver this important project for Sydney.
