Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which the Western Harbour Tunnel is being constructed, including the Gadigal, Cammeraygal, and Wangal peoples, as well as the Aboriginal peoples of Emu Plains, and we pay respect to Elders past and present.



Transport for NSW (Transport) is committed to reconnecting people to the history, land and waters of Berrys Bay through the delivery of a new foreshore parkland.

Transport prepared a landscape master plan for the parkland in 2022, shaped by North Sydney Council and community consultation. The master plan provides a vision to transform the former industrial land at Berrys Bay into a foreshore park.

We will be seeking further community feedback on the detailed design of Berrys Bay via the Place, Design and Landscape Plan process. Since the Berrys Bay master plan was approved, Transport has been working closely with key local stakeholders including North Sydney Council, to progress the detailed design.

While we have been progressing well with the design, we acknowledge there has been a delay to our original timeline, due to:

- ongoing consultation with key stakeholders
- requiring a Modification to the Western Harbour Tunnel planning approval, which was determined in January 2024
- further site investigations and inspections of existing structures
- completion of the Heritage Impact Assessment to ensure the integration of heritage items.



Berrys Bay Place, Design and Landscape Plan (PDLP)

The Berrys Bay project will be delivered by the Western Harbour Tunnel (WHT) Stage 2 construction contractor, ACCIONA via a Place, Design and Landscape Plan (PDLP). The WHT PDLP will be presented in three parts for community feedback and Berrys Bay will be part two.

The master plan along with site analysis and design principles, will guide the detailed design of Berrys Bay via the PDLP process.

We will be seeking further feedback from stakeholders and the community on this detailed design from late 2024.

A PDLP process is required as a Minister's Condition of Approval to determine the final approved design for Berrys Bay.
