

# Western Harbour Tunnel

## Community Update

March 2022



The NSW Government’s vision for Sydney is one of an integrated road and public transport network that gives you the freedom to choose how and when you get around, no matter where you live and work.

The Western Harbour Tunnel is a major transport infrastructure project that will make it easier, faster and safer to get around Sydney. By creating a western bypass of the Sydney CBD, the Western Harbour Tunnel will take pressure off the Sydney Harbour Bridge, Sydney Harbour Tunnel, Anzac Bridge and Western Distributor corridors to improve transport capacity in and around Sydney Harbour.


### Early work

#### Geotechnical investigations and groundwater monitor installation

Early work activities are progressing to help inform the detailed design for the tunnel alignment. Early work activities include geotechnical investigations on land and in Sydney Harbour, and installation of groundwater monitoring wells. This work is ongoing and is expected to be completed by late April 2022 (weather permitting). Regular groundwater monitoring will continue to take place for around two years.

#### Temporary power work

From early May 2022 we expect to start carrying out temporary power installation work along Balls Head Road, Waverton to Hazelbank Road, Wollstonecraft. This work will provide temporary power to our Berrys Bay construction site to support main work activities. Work will be completed in stages, and residents will be provided more information in the coming weeks.

# Main work

Main work for the Western Harbour Tunnel (excluding the Warringah Freeway upgrade work) will be delivered in two packages.

## Stage 1


Stage 1 is the construction of the southern section of the tunnel from the Rozelle Interchange site to Birchgrove.

In January 2022, a contract was awarded to John Holland and CPB Joint Venture for Stage 1 of the Western Harbour Tunnel tunnelling work, which is expected to start from mid-2022.

## Stage 2

Stage 2 will see construction of the northern tunnels, which includes connections to the Warringah Freeway near North Sydney, marine work through Sydney Harbour and complete tunnel fit-out.

The procurement process for Stage 2 is underway and a contract is expected to be awarded in late 2022.
