

Burleigh works: Step one

Gold Coast Highway, Burleigh Heads Connor Street to West Burleigh Road

John Holland will commence major works in the Burleigh Heads business centre from mid-June 2023. Work in the area will progress throughout the next 24 months and will be undertaken in steps. This notification provides information about step one works in Burleigh Heads.

Works include

Site establishment and service investigations

- Underground utility investigations will involve the use of concrete cutters, and non-destructive digging trucks to cut sections of the road and footpath away
- Installation of temporary lighting from Connor Street to West Burleigh Road.

Utility relocation (road crossing works)

- Relocating existing overhead electricity infrastructure underneath the Gold Coast Highway from Alby Adams Park to Justin Lane. This involves saw cutting and trenching across the Gold Coast Highway.

Water relocation (footpath works)

- Installing a temporary water diversion for businesses on the Gold Coast Highway (northbound) adjacent to Justin Lane
- This involves removing existing street infrastructure, non-destructive digging, installing water pipes and connecting properties onto the new temporary water connection
- Temporary works are required to enable permanent utility relocations later in 2023.

What to expect

- Increase in construction activity including noise, vibration, and vehicle movements within and near to the works area
- Works will occur overnight while traffic volumes on Gold Coast Highway are lower.

Works will be noisy and disruptive at times. Every effort will be taken to minimise impacts.

Traffic changes

Parking

- Temporary closures to on-street parking between Connor Street and West Street, Burleigh Heads will occur at times.

Pedestrians and access

- Access to businesses and properties will be maintained. Temporary water bypass works will occur across business entrances and works will occur overnight to minimise disruption.

Vehicles and bike riders

- Reduced speed limits and modified on-road traffic signage
- Traffic management will be in place to assist users to safely navigate around the works area. Please follow on-road signage and drive safely.

Timing

Site establishment and service investigations

- From Monday 12 June 2023 for up to two weeks.

Utility relocation (road crossing works)

- From Monday 12 June to July 2023.

Water relocation (footpath works)

- From 19 June 2023 for up to three weeks.

Day works

6.30am to 6.30pm, Monday to Saturday.

Night works* will be carried out between 6.30pm and 6.30am, Sunday to Thursday nights.



No works will occur on Public Holidays unless otherwise notified. Wet weather or unforeseen circumstances may result in changes to the work schedule.

Step two works will commence following the completion of step one, which will involve a work area on the northbound side of the Gold Coast Highway.
