Project update

April 2022

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The NSW Government is delivering a new Sydney Fish Market that will support tourism and the fishing industry, strengthening Sydney's position as one of Australia's leading tourist destinations.

Construction update

Construction of the new Sydney Fish Market is on track, despite the challenges of COVID-19 and the weather.

Activities on site include:

- Installing marine piles to support the new building.
 More than 40% of the marine piling is now complete.
- Continuing construction of cofferdam, with four piling machines now on site.
- Revetment and shoring works to stabilise the existing seawall.

Upcoming works

Over the next three months, construction activities will include:

- · Continue marine and promenade piling.
- · Continue cofferdam construction.
- Land-based piling activities at the interface to where the building footprint meets the land.
- Power upgrade works to provide permanent high voltage electricity supply to the New Sydney Fish Market project from the zone substation in Camperdown.
- Temporary site amenities serving the project will be constructed adjacent to the site within Sydney Secondary College, providing facilities for workers and direct access to and from the construction site.

Did you know?

The cofferdam is currently being constructed utilising Giken Japanese technology. This ultra-low noise technology minimises noise impacts as piles are installed using a pressin method which uses force from previously driven piles to slide steel in. Typically, piles are installed utilising vibratory hammers, which are considerably louder due to the vibration of steel on steel. The cofferdam is expected to be dewatered in late August 2022.

Seabins cleaning up Blackwattle Bay

There are now five Seabins installed in and around the construction site of the new Sydney Fish Market in Blackwattle Bay, These Seabins work by skimming the surface of the water to capture floating marine debris and filter out plastics, microfibres, oil and other harmful contaminants. Filtered water is then pumped back into Blackwattle Bay leaving debris in the catch bag managed by Seabin's Environmental technicians. We look forward to sharing the progress of how Seabins are helping to clean the waterways of Blackwattle Bay in the coming months.

Power upgrades

Starting in May this year, work will commence on delivering high voltage power supply to the new Sydney Fish Market from an existing zone substation in Camperdown. This will involve trenching and installing conduit and cabling along a route from Lyons Road, Camperdown to the new Sydney Fish Market site, mainly via Bridge Road, Glebe. This significant program of works will take several months and mainly occur at night.
