# M6 Stage 1 Urban Design and Landscape Plan

The M6 Stage 1 will deliver major road improvements and provide linkages to the broader motorway network. At its heart is the vision of transforming parklands that Connect with Country and enhance the natural environment for the community to live, play and experience.

## What is the M6 Stage 1 Urban Design and Landscape Plan (UDLP)?

The UDLP is our proposed plan for a new Marsh Street Park in Arncliffe, a reinstated Rockdale Bicentennial Park, the shared pedestrian and cyclist pathway, and the M6 tunnel experience.

The UDLP provides a framework for the M6 Stage 1 project to deliver community parklands, places to gather, recreational facilities and amenities. Our aim is to connect people and places across suburbs with new footpaths and cycleways.


Green spaces and wetlands within the project alignment will be locally restored and revitalised. A diverse variety of local trees and vegetation will be planted, providing natural shade, colour, and texture.

The draft UDLP has been developed in collaboration with Bayside Council as the relevant landowner and asset owner for the ultimate open space and recreation facilities that will be constructed on land currently occupied for construction of the M6 Stage 1 project.

# What does the UDLP deliver?



















- Heritage and culture: Five distinct parkland artworks co-created with local Aboriginal artists will be integrated within the overall design of the park. Artworks will be multidimensional and linked by a unifying theme of 'a place of sand and water.' The five artworks represent the botanical manifestation of five sisters who have come to the park to bring a sense of healing to the land, water and sky.
- **Recreation:** The design caters for a range of community activities. These include a youth hub with BMX pump track, half basketball court stations, a new all abilities playground, sportsfields, plus reinstated player and spectator facilities. Picnic shelters with tables and seats as well as passive community lawn areas round out the design.
- Shared pedestrian and cyclist pathway: A five-kilometre shared pedestrian and cyclist pathway will start at Bestic Street, Brighton-Le-Sands, link to the existing cycleway at Muddy Creek, and will continue south through Rockdale Bicentennial Park and Scarborough Park, ending at Chuter Avenue, Monterey. There are a number of bridges and boardwalks proposed to provide connections to existing paths and ensure safety across roads. The bridge over President Avenue will be a key connection point.









**Recreation:** Playing fields are designed to cater for local sporting needs as well as serve as a flexible space for community events. A children's playground is designed to cater for toddlers to young teens based on nature inspired play design. A fitness station, BMX pump track and BBQ areas are located around the active recreational elements, enabling all the community to enjoy this


and support functions of the tunnel including ventilation facilities.



**Shared pedestrian and cyclist pathway:** Entry to the park is provided from Marsh Street via a 4.5m wide shared user path which continues past the Motorway Operations Complex and forms a continuous loop path through the parklands. Entry to the park is to be accessible for all mobility levels and promote a variety of activity and interaction within the parkland.

#### Tunnel entrance at President Avenue, Brighton-Le-Sands





The concept of the tunnel portals is based on Aboriginal design principles, developed in collaboration with Local knowledge holders and Elders. A mural, designed by an Aboriginal artist etched into the concrete at the entrance to the tunnel at President Avenue provides a Welcome to Country statement, for pedestrians and motorists.



Within the tunnel itself, a cultural marker is proposed in both the local Indigenous language and in English. These words bring cultural meaning to place, are significant to the Local Elders and are positioned either side of the Suburb wayfinding markers.



## What happens to your submission?

All feedback received during the public exhibition period will be considered and documented. This will be provided to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) in line with the Minister's Conditions of Approval. We will

inform you when a summary of feedback and final UDLP is available on the project website.

Once approved, the urban design and landscape elements from the UDLP is projected to be completed by late 2025.
